Dr. Quintin B. Bullock

Dr. Quintin B. Bullock is the ninth president of the Community College of Allegheny County, a multi-campus institution serving approximately 30,000 credit students. He is a consummate professional, an experienced educator, an effective community leader, an empathetic mentor, and a positive role model for students and aspiring leaders, with an extensive, diverse professional background in higher education. He is a proven and results-oriented community college president who is recognized for his exemplary leadership and for being a powerful advocate for the students and communities he serves. Additionally, Dr. Bullock is the Dean for the Men of Color Student Leadership Institute.

Dr. Bullock's community and professional affiliations are many. He is on the boards of Vibrant Pittsburgh, Caring Place Foundation, Partners 4 Work, Youth Places, the Buhl Foundation, Pittsburgh Public Theater, Allegheny Conference for Community Development and the Presidents' Roundtable. In addition, he serves on numerous local committees and special projects. For his work and advocacy Dr. Bullock has received numerous awards and honors.



Dr. Roosevelt Charles

Dr. Roosevelt Charles serves Dean of Counseling and Student Success at Foothill College, a division charged with exploring and implementing practices and policies that responds to issues and improve performance outcomes for all student groups. Being a first-generation college student who grew up in Louisiana surrounded by a working-class community with multigenerational families, such upbringing brought clarity to his interest in working at community college. He holds a doctorate in education from the University of Hartford.



Mr. Ron McCullough

Mr. Ron McCullough serves as an Instructor of Communication at Hillsborough Community College (HCC) in Tampa, Florida. He has earned a Bachelor of Science in Organizational Leadership and Supervision and a Master of Arts in Communication from Purdue University.

As a native from Chicago, IL, Mr. McCullough was instrumental in creating a Minority Male Initiative during his tenure at Ivy Tech Community College in Northwest Indiana. Additionally, he serves as a mentor for Black and Latino males for the HCC Hope Scholars program, which involves encouraging and motivating students both in and out of the classroom. As well, he is a faculty advisor for HCC's Collegiate 100 where he mentors students to improve their academic performance and leadership skills.



Mr. Terrell Tigner

Mr. Terrell Tigner serves as the Dean of Student Development and Enrollment at Metropolitan Community College (MCC) Kansas City, Maple Woods campus. He holds a Bachelor of Arts-Communication/Media Production and Masters of Business Administration (MBA) from Avila University (Kansas City, MO).

As a Detroit, Michigan native and a resident of Kansas City, Missouri, Mr. Tigner understands the importance of higher education and is a strong advocate for student success. He has spent twenty-two years in higher education, with seventeen of those years being in a community college setting. This has allowed him to work with many types of students, faculty/staff, and initiatives that promote student access, retention, and success. This includes his work in creating and maintaining the Men of Color, Courage, and Character (MOC3) program at MCC. During his time as a student, student-athlete and higher education professional, Mr. Tigner has received numerous awards for his character and efforts. He is a firm believer in promoting student grit and teaching students to "starve their nightmares and feed their dreams."

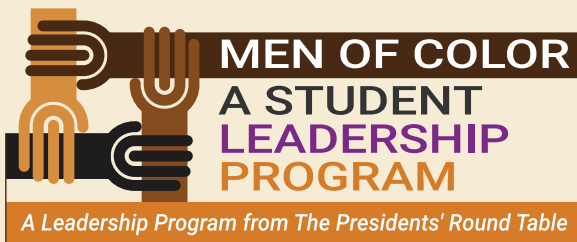
Mr. David Motley
